

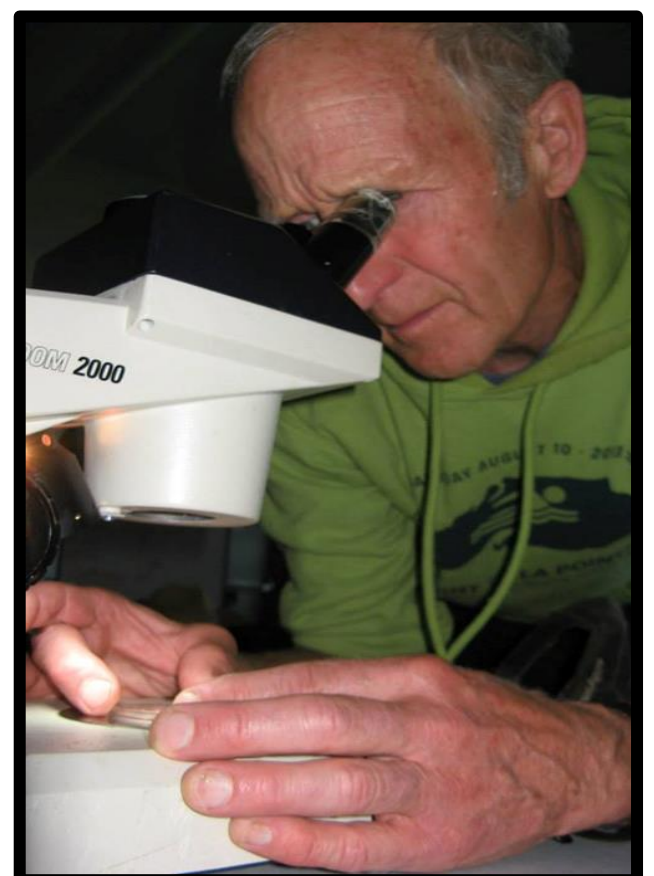
PLANTS AND ANIMALS OF WISCONSIN'S WATERS

Key Concept: *Understand that aquatic plants and animals are adapted to survive and prosper in the unique conditions of Wisconsin's lakes and streams.*

- Food webs in Wisconsin's aquatic habitats are fundamentally the same as food webs on dry land, but have uniqueness due to the aquatic environment.
